## CIHR Sex- and Gender-Based Analysis Trainee Abstract Award

The CIHR Institute of Circulatory and Respiratory Health (ICRH) and Institute Gender and Health (IGH) have partnered to create a new award for trainee abstracts submitted to World Sleep 2019. The CIHR Sex- and Gender-Based Analysis Trainee Abstract Award will recognize the trainee abstract that best demonstrates appropriate integration of sex and/or gender analysis into the research. Judges will evaluate all scientific abstracts submitted by trainees to World Sleep 2019 and score the integration of sex and/gender based analysis using a standardized rubric. The winner will receive a certificate and a monetary prize of \$250, which will be presented at the CSS/CIHR-ICRH Trainee Research Day as part of World Sleep 2019.
