Nominations will be assessed against the evaluation criteria listed below. Please ensure you provide the appropriate detailed information in order for the review committee to assess the candidates accordingly.

Note:

- If duplicate nominations are received for a single Nominee, Sponsors may be contacted to collaborate on a single coordinated nomination
- Scientists who have received a Distinguished Lecturer Award previously are not eligible for nomination
- Nominations for highly competitive candidates not selected will be carried forward for consideration up to three (3) consecutive years from the original nomination year

Note: nominations will be assessed against the following evaluation criteria:

1. Impact of nominee's research on respiratory sciences both in Canada and internationally; extent to which the nominee has contributed significantly to the advancement of respiratory sciences both in Canada and internationally (e.g., important/key research results or findings) over the last ten years.
2. Relevance/application/impact of nominee's research to a clinical setting (i.e., translational research; "from bench to bedside").
3. Demonstrated strength and reputation of the proposed nominee in the field of respiratory sciences in Canada and internationally.
4. Impact of the nominee's mentorship and training environment on the development of young scientists and other highly qualified personnel in Canada and internationally.
